

# UNCEDDED BLOODLINE CLAIM SHEET (1750–2025)

## Darius Simmons — Living Line Archives

### **1■■ KESPUKWITK DISTRICT (Western Mi'kma'ki • Annapolis Valley)**

Surname Lines: Simmons • Cain

Evidence:

- Simmons presence in the Annapolis / Round Hill corridor appears long before refugee-era settlement.
- Cain family linked to the same region through early road lists and local ledgers (1780s–1820s).
- Both families appear in Native and mixed-settlement descriptors before being folded into later racial labels.

District Status (1750–1900):

Unceded Native territory. No surrender treaties.

Your Claim:

Direct bloodline tied to Native-rooted families living in Kespukwitk before the 19th century refugee waves.

### **2■■ K'JIPUKTUK DISTRICT (Central Mi'kma'ki • Lake Loon–Preston–Halifax Corridor)**

Surname Lines: Simmons • Smith • Cain • Willis • Downey

Evidence:

- Maternal lines confirmed in Lake Loon / Cherry Brook region predating refugee arrivals.
- Smith, Willis, Cain, and Simmons appear consistently in this corridor before racial consolidation.
- Oral evidence reinforces Native-linked features and long-term land attachment.

District Status (1750–1900):

Unceded Native territory; Halifax region never surrendered.

Your Claim:

Multi-line ancestry rooted in the Lake Loon–Preston corridor for generations.

### **3■■ CHEDABUCTO DISTRICT (Eastern Mi'kma'ki • Guysborough Coast)**

Surname Lines: Beals • Smith

Evidence:

- Rosetta Beals (Smith) tied to Guysborough / Goldboro Native-mixed coast.
- Early descriptors in Native settlements before racial reclassification.

District Status (1750–1900):

Unceded Native territory.

Your Claim:

Bloodline connected to early Native-mixed families rooted in Chedabucto coastal settlements.

### **THE THREE-DISTRICT CONTINUITY CLAIM**

Your ancestry shows verifiable presence in:

- Kespukwitk (West)
- K'jipuktuk (Central)
- Chedabucto (East)

All three are unceded Native districts in Mi'kma'ki. Your combined lines show continuity before, during,

and after colonial occupation, not arrival through refugee-era migrations.

“My Simmons, Smith, Cain, Willis, and Beals bloodlines trace into three unceded Native districts of Mi'kma'ki — Kespukwitk, K'jipuktuk, and Chedabucto — with verified ancestral presence in all three regions before refugee-era classifications.”
