The Living Line interprets surnames by district first. These three unceded districts form the geographic backbone of the lineage:

1. Kespukwitk (Southwest)

Earliest Native-settled mixed families appear here through early ledgers and road records — the oldest continuity signals.

2. K'jipuktuk (Preston-Halifax Corridor)

The maternal stronghold including Lake Loon and Cherry Brook. Native-linked presence predates refugee consolidation.

This corridor is the center of the Living Line.

3. Chedabucto (Eastern Shore)

Early coastal settlements show Native-mixed families who were later reclassified. Patterns represent label drift,

not migration.

Summary:

Across all three districts, families show Native descriptors, land continuity, and reclassification during the

refugee-consolidation era. These patterns verify pre-refugee Native presence and establish the structural map

for the Living Line.
